


































MSU IDEA SHOP

The MSU Idea Shop is about bringing concepts to reality, and ultimately into the hands of customers. Located in a 2,000 sq. ft. retail store on Main Street in Starkville, the facility houses the Turner A. Wingo Maker Studio and MSU Retail Product Accelerator.



IDEA SHOP NUMBERS

- Estimated total number of visitors 3,000.
- Monthly Memberships 60
- Day Passes -20-30
- Custom Orders/Prototypes (Not counting prototypes built by individuals in the shop)- 15 Custom Orders completed through the shop including 2 prototypes. With another 8 or so prototypes either being worked on currently or in the initial meetings.
- 3D Printing Almost 3,000-4,000 hours of prints completed.


