Statutory Authority


- Strengthen regional innovation initiatives
- Build innovation-based businesses
- Scale new products, processes, and services in the market
- Achieve measurable economic impacts such as new business starts, jobs, venture capital raised in the region, and more

B2S awards promote technology-based economic development through investments that strengthen the direct drivers of high-growth industry clusters

CAPITAL

Addressing critical equity financing gaps by launching new equity-based funds, disseminating tools to facilitate broader access to funds, and scaling existing investment groups.

JOB GROWTH

High-quality jobs and access to career ladders in durable, growing economic and technology sectors.

ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEMS

Solutions that include community buy-in, local ownership, and regional benefits.

DIVERSITY & EQUITY

Diversity in geographies, economic sectors, as well as the beneficiaries of these programs.



Available Funds By Year








FY21 Build to Scale Award Breakdown

Venture Challenge

Seeks to advance technology-based economic development in regional innovation ecosystems that promote the commercialization of new technologies, strengthen growing industry clusters, and lead to the expansion of high-paying economic opportunities in communities, regions, or combinations of regions.



Venture Challenge

Competitive proposals will support technology-based industries that are
producing scalable businesses
leveraging regional assets and untapped resources
commercializing and fostering technology adoption
furthering the creation of high-quality jobs



Venture Challenge



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pilots a solution to a demonstrated need, or

implements a proven solution in a new context

up to \$750k in federal funding over the grant period

Scale

adapts or augments an existing initiative with proven impacts, **and**

demonstrates past success in program execution

up to \$2m in federal funding over the grant period



Capital Challenge

Seeks to **increase access to capital**, particularly in communities where there is a limited supply of **equity-based funding** and a demonstrated opportunity **to invest** in technology-based businesses aligned with growing **industry and technology clusters**.



Capital Challenge

 Provides operational support for growing and deploying equity capital into tech startups equipping the next generation of investment managers facilitating dealflow, due diligence, and closing deals introducing new equity-based investment opportunities



Capital Challenge



Form	identifies and organizes investors within a region				
	builds capacity to source, vet, and close deals				
	up to \$300k in federal funding over the grant period				
Deploy	connects new investors with technology-based, cluster- aligned startups				
	raises equity funds and closes investments in companies with high-growth potential				
	up to \$750k in federal funding over the grant period				



General Rules



No direct investment into companies or entrepreneurs



Only 1 application is allowed per Challenge



Only eligible entities can apply and receive funding



Eligible recipients must provide a 1:1 match



Technical Requirements

These technical deficiencies can result in your application being rejected!



Passing technical review is a prerequisite for merit review

The <u>last day</u> to request presubmission technical review is **May 20th**



Pre-Submission Requirements

You need a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) to apply.

What is a UEI?

- The Unique Entity ID is a 12-character alphanumeric ID assigned to an entity by <u>SAM.gov.</u> The Unique Entity ID is a 12-character alphanumeric ID assigned to an entity by <u>SAM.gov</u>.
- Entity registration, searching, and data entry in <u>SAM.gov</u> now require use of the UEI.

Do I need a UEI if I have a DUNS number?

 As of April 4th, the DUNS Number has been removed from SAM.gov.

How do I find my organization's UEI?

- New entities can get their Unique Entity ID at <u>SAM.gov</u> and, if required, complete an entity registration.
- Existing registered entities can find their UEI by going to FSD.gov and selecting "HELP ON UEI TRANSITION"

Other Pre-Submission Requirements

These tasks may require 3-4 weeks to complete due to system processing requirements. Prospective applicants should begin as early as possible.

- ✓ Grants.gov registration EDA will only accept applications from this portal and registration is required to submit
- ✓ SAM.gov registration or renewal applicants without an active SAM registration may not be considered for funding
- ✓ SPOC compliance (if applicable) required for projects with primary service areas locating in participating States described in Executive Order 12372, "Intergovernmental Review of Federal Programs"



EDA <u>STRONGLY SUGGESTS THAT APPLICANTS SUBMIT THEIR APPLICATIONS AT LEAST FIVE</u>

(5) <u>DAYS BEFORE THE DEADLINE</u> to allow the application to be accepted and validated in the system and to allow time for any errors to be corrected.



Eligible Entities

- A State;
- An Indian tribe;
- A city or other political subdivision of a State;
- An entity whose application is supported by a State or a political subdivision of a State and that is

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a nonprofit organization,
an institution of higher education,
a public-private partnership*,
a science or research park,
a Federal laboratory*,
a venture development organization*,
an economic development organization*; or
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A consortium of the above



^{*} These types of entities can have complex eligibility determinations, so we encourage you to reach out to EDA early if your applicant organization is organized in one of these ways.

Requesting Administrative & Technical Guidance

EDA cannot provide strategic advice or partnership development support during the competition and must limit its advice to administrative and technical concerns about the competition and application process.







 Content beyond the 10th page will not be reviewed.





Project Narrative, cont.'d

A competitive Project Narrative will...

- ✓ Be clear and concise
- ✓ Identify a defined gap and propose feasible strategies to fill it
- ✓ Leverage partnerships and explain the roles of those partners
- ✓ Contain key milestones + dates
- ✓ Identify an achievable scope of work
- ✓ Use metrics to estimate the long-term potential impact



Budget Narrative & Staffing Plan

Refer to pp. 11-12 of the NOFO

Budget Narrative

- Explains how funds will be used to achieve objectives outlined in the Project Narrative and reflects matching funds described in the commitment letter(s).
- Common mistakes
 - Ineligible use of funding see section D.7 for updated guidance
 - Insufficient match
 - Proposed uses don't align with the scope of work
 - Inputs are inconsistent with the SF-424 and SF-424A



- Includes titles, maximum annual salaries, percentage of time dedicated to the project, and the total amount of annual salaries that would be charged to the project.
- Common mistakes
 - Unclear personnel roles
 - Vague job descriptions for unfilled positions
 - Lack of clarity in which roles lead and support the project
 - Line item total doesn't correspond with Budget Narrative & SF-424A

Match Requirement

A minimum one-to-one (1:1) match **is required** for all Build to Scale awards, whether under the Venture or Capital Challenges.

Matching share <u>greater</u> than the 1:1 requirement will be accepted but is not necessary to qualify for funding and <u>will not make</u> <u>an application more competitive</u>

Government Support

- Only required for applicants that <u>are not</u> States, Indian tribes, units of government, or public institutions of higher education.
- Support from non-governmental entities (e.g. economic development districts, councils of government, chambers of commerce) <u>does not meet</u> this requirement.
- Support from Federal officials, including but not limited to members of the United States Congress, <u>does not meet</u> this requirement.
- Authorities that indicate support should have <u>constituencies</u> that encompass all or a substantial portion of the project service area.

Merit Review Criteria

- Apply to both Venture and Capital Challenge applications
- Only applications that pass technical review will be reviewed for merit
- Each of the following categories are equally weighted:

Ecosystem Resources, Assets, and Equity

•To what extent do you agree that the region's assets and needs are clearly defined, explained, and aligned with the proposed project?

Proposed Solution

•To what extent do you agree that the proposed solution is achievable, aligned with the opportunity and meets the needs of its target participants and population?

Partner Entities

•To what extent do you agree that the application clearly and realistically defines the roles of potential partner entities and demonstrates that resources from potential partner entities will be leveraged in a way that will result in ecosystem growth that is greater than the sum of the individual partners' contributions?

Merit Review Criteria cont'd.

Measurable Goals

•To what extent do you agree that the project goals are specific, measurable, attainable, relevant, and time-bound (SMART) and, if achieved, would advance the target innovation ecosystem and its participants?

Continued Impacts

•To what extent do you agree that the proposed project will continue to increase the ecosystem's ability to enable technology entrepreneurs to start and grow after the grant period, whether with future financial support or by becoming realistically self-sustaining?

Budget & Staffing

•To what extent do you agree that the application clearly identifies the financial, human, and programmatic resources that will support the successful execution of this proposed project and that the applicant organization and team have the operations and management capacities to execute the proposed project successfully?

Alignment with B2S Goals

•To what extent do you agree that the submission conveys a clear narrative that addresses the prompts in this NOFO and that aligns with the Build to Scale program goal to "build regional economies through scalable startups"?
