

- The Economic Development Administration's (EDA's) Recompete Pilot Program will
 provide grant funding to distressed communities across the country to create, and
 connect workers to, good jobs and support long-term comprehensive economic
 development by helping to reduce the high, prime-age (25 to 54 years of age)
 employment gap.
- The Recompete Pilot Program aims to alleviate persistent economic distress, support long-term comprehensive economic development and spur job creation in the most distressed communities.
- The Recompete Pilot Program was enacted as part of the CHIPS and Science Act of 2022 (as the Distressed Area Recompete Pilot Program). Congress appropriated EDA \$200 million of the \$1 billion authorized for the program as part of the FY 2023 Omnibus Appropriations Bill.
- As part of the Recompete Pilot Program design, EDA will continue its regional and place-based focus – building on examples and lessons learned from EDA's Build Back Better Regional Challenge and Good Jobs Challenge programs.
- On February 23, 2023, EDA issued a Recompete Pilot Program Request for Information (RFI) in the <u>Federal Register</u> to solicit public input about the program's planning and design. Responses are due by 5 p.m. Eastern Time on March 27, 2023. Responses may be submitted via email to <u>Recompete@eda.gov</u>. Details on responding can be found in the <u>Federal Register</u>.
- The Recompete Pilot Program is currently under development by EDA. A Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is expected to be released in the first half of 2023.
