### EXAMPLE PROJECT

In FY2023, EDA awarded **\$1,345,950 in Economic Adjustment Assistance - Assistance to Coal Communities funds to support the City of Lexington** with upgrading the natural gas distribution system to provide improve natural gas capacity at an industrial site necessary for the expansion of a major steel-manufacturing facility in Davidson County, North Carolina. The upgrades include engineering, surveying, and constructing a steel pipeline.
