### EXAMPLE PROJECT

In FY2023, EDA awarded **\$1,500,000 in Economic Adjustment Assistance - Assistance to Coal Communities funds to support the First Utility District of Hawkins County** with the installation of a transmission line along Burlington Road and down the 11W corridor to upgrade the existing water system in Hawkins County, Tennessee. The project will provide a local business with the necessary water to increase business and will ensure the county has the essential infrastructure for future growth in the area.
