### EXAMPLE PROJECT

In FY2023, EDA awarded **\$1,381,500 in Economic Adjustment Assistance – Assistance to Coal Communities funds to support the building of an aircraft maintenance technician campus training facility and hangar in Carbon County, Utah.**

Carbon County is partnering with Utah State University Eastern to address the local and regional workforce training needs in the region by establishing the Aviation Campus Workforce Development program, which will support the transition of displaced coal workers into other high-paying occupations that will further serve regional growth. Graduates of the training program will not only be qualified for well-paying career options in aviation maintenance, but also will be able to pursue careers in alternative energy development, automotive mechanical work, and other industries.
